ADVOCACY AT WORK LOCAL LINK

The Battlefords & District Chamber of Commerce, in the past few years, has undertaken community development projects to support and promote the Battlefords, but also support and promote our members as well as business community. In 2023, we launched the new online "Re location Guide", which showcases what the community has to offer, all in one place, and making a move for folks to the community an easy one-stop website for information.

Since the Chamber is in the 'solutions' business; we found in 2024 a community information solution to add to the community support, and launched Local Link, where people, whether locals, tourists, guests, or visitors, can easily find out information about the community, places to eat, places to shop, and things to do, and more.

Local Link is the first of its kind network in Saskatchewan, with multiple free standing touch screen kiosk units in the community that people can utilize to get information. And for businesses and organizations to promote themselves to the wider community. There are currently 5 units in use, but the goal is to have a broader network of 10-12 units, and then to move to some specialized kiosks for special events. For example, we plan to host at least one seasonal unit, that could perhaps be hosted at Jackfish Lodge Golf & Conference Centre in the summer months, move to the Access Communications Centre in October for the Rodeo Finals and then out to Table Mountain Ski Hill for the winter, as an example. We also would like to see units available for special events or conventions in the region, that could be at the location for a weekend or a week, depending on the event and its draw. Ultimately, we would like to see the network develop to a regional network of connected communities, and even host some 'outdoor' units that could be available 24-7 to the public.

This of course, all takes time and money, and the network development continues as we speak. The project is just starting to come to fruition, and we hope you will have an opportunity to be part of the Local Link information kiosk network in the Battlefords! Discover your community! Be part of the network in 2025.

ADVOCACY AT WORK News & Notes from the Chair Glenda Rye



Prior to undertaking the office of Chair of the Board, Glenda put in motion her plan to get to meet as many members in-person as possible. She has continued throughout the year to work on that, and though she has not gotten to everyone yet, she has found some consistent trends develop.

Firstly, virtually each business visited talked about the need for employees, at all levels, across all sectors. The Chamber moved on this and was a proponent of an application

to the federal government on a municipal immigration pilot, that would have seen 15 communities across the country get priority in bringing in skilled workers to fill gaps in specific sectors and in specific jobs. We just heard that the applications in the province including ours were not successful, but the government has not yet announced which 15 communities across the country have been awarded the





The Chamber undertook an application for Re-Accreditation for, now, a five-year term 2025-2029. Accreditation is a formal recognition that a Chamber of Commerce has met the highest national standards of excellence in leadership, governance and operations. To be accredited a Chamber must pass a rigorous review of its policies and procedures by the Chamber Accreditation Council of Canada (CACC). The CACC promotes Accredited Chambers of Commerce for standing out as exceptional organizations and leaders in the Chamber network. The local Chamber was first awarded its accreditation for a term 2022-2024.

> opportunity to move forward. So, we will continue to work in this area. Potential exists to move on a region wide Job/ Career Fair in the new year. We'll keep you posted.

Secondly, other big issues included government red tape (at all levels), taxation (at all levels), and a perceived lack of support from community leaders for the business community. To that end, the Chamber has encouraged the City of North Battleford to undertake a study of (commercial) taxation in the community, to identify if the 60/40 split (residential to commercial) is still a valid goal, and to identify if the current assessment model is the best and most equitable for all ratepayers. We understand that request will be considered in the City's 2025 Budget.

Strong businesses are the lifeblood of the community, and while we have a strong business community, it is her goal to continue to see it grow and get even stronger, with support from the local and provincial leaders, and members like you.

New businesses to the community with good paying jobs, and incremental average household incomes will support growth and development of our business community and its opportunities. The businesses visited, all saw growth and potential here, so now the job will be to capitalize on that potential.
